PASTORAL LETTER

Dear BPCWAians,

After months of intensive planning, we have just concluded the BPCWA Young Adults Camp this week, joined by several interstate and out of country visitors. We thank God for the labour of the committee in planning for it, and also for the many in our midst who helped out in some way or other. Beginning from last Sunday's fellowship lunch, many of you pitched in by cooking and bringing more food. In true Christian graciousness, many in our midst have also extended their hospitality and help to visitors in so many ways, by opening their homes for them to stay in, and by cooking or helping out in the transport. Indeed, even in the testimonies on the closing night, many visitors gave glory to God for the Christian hospitality they've received, and expressed their gratefulness for the warm fellowship they experienced during their visit here.

Mark 9:41 For whosoever shall give you a cup of water to drink in my name, because ye belong to Christ, verily I say unto you, he shall not lose his reward.

Many of you have also laboured together with us by praying for the camp as well. This was important because despite all the physical planning, it was ultimately to serve a spiritual purpose. What were some of our intentions in having such a camp? What did we want to achieve?

Learning God's Word together. In university and for those just starting out in the working world, this is a time in their lives where they are going through great changes. The temptations and allures of the world are very real, and can become the thorns that may hinder their fruitfulness for God. As the world attempts to choke

the word in their hearts, it becomes even more important that they be reinforced in their faith. Camps are good avenues of retreat for refreshing by intensive study of Scriptures.

Being part of sound churches. In an increasingly interconnected world, many are also travelling more often, whether for work or for leisure. We also may have friends that may travel overseas, for work, studies or leisure. Getting to know each other at the camp as out of state brethren and BPCWAians mingle together at the camp, we hope that they can then know where are the sound churches where they (or their friends) can worship when they travel, work, or study there. Hence we also arranged for campers to represent their churches to share details regarding their worship services, Bible studies, how to get to their church, and who to contact should any wish to visit their church.

Standing together for the faith. We have a blessed heritage of standing faithful *for the word of God, and for the testimony of Jesus Christ* (Rev 1:9) amidst an age of falling away. However, we cannot take it for granted. This heritage can be lost in one generation, and we hope that the camp will help us to appreciate the soundness of doctrines that we enjoy today, and be stirred to continue to *earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints* (Jude 1:3). With a gathering of brethren from like minded churches, there is mutual encouragement to know that they are not alone in the battle for the Lord.

With the above aims, the camp committee laboured and prayed. Coordinating transport, accommodations, and logistics was no small task. We thank God for His wisdom and enabling grace upon all.

All glory to God for bringing the camp to pass, keeping everyone safe, granting blessed fellowship, and most importantly for feeding His children with His Word.
